

Pupil Premium

At The Magdalen Primary School we support all our pupils. We do this by providing high quality classroom teaching, supplemented by interventions to support vulnerable learners as and when required. The School Leadership Team and Governing Body monitor the impact of all spending and interventions, including the Pupil Premium .We endeavour to encourage parents and carers to apply for free school meals where pride, stigma or changing circumstances act as barriers to its take up.

Key Facts

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from families who are currently known to be eligible for FSM in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. The Government has decided that eligibility for the Pupil Premium in 2012-13 will be extended to pupils who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last 6 years. The reason for this is that, as a group, children who have been eligible for FSM at any point in time have consistently lower educational attainment than those who have never been eligible for FSM.

Nature of support 2012/13

The Pupil Premium funding received at The Magdalen Primary School has been allocated in a number of ways.

Amount	Purpose
£4,000	Improvements to the whole school learning environment, allowing all pupils the opportunity to thrive and develop a 'thirst for learning'.
£13,000	Targeted support for FSM and disadvantaged pupils in English and Maths
£11,000	Small intervention and withdrawal groups for FSM and disadvantaged pupils in all core subjects
£16,000	Individual and group support for pupils learning and development for FSM and disadvantaged pupils
£3,000	Subsidisation of educational visits, allowing children the opportunity to enjoy a wealth of different experiences outside of their own locality.
£1,470	The provision of music tuition for targeted pupils
£5,000	The development of pupils reading skills and comprehension and the opportunity to use and read more widely with the purchase of improved resources.
£1,000	Provision of respite care for targeted children at Kids club and holiday club.
